Mines Retained For Training in Mine Detection, Mine Clearance, or Mine Destruction Techniques (Article 3)

May 2006

Article 3 of the Mine Ban Treaty permits the retention or transfer of a number of antipersonnel mines for the development of and training in mine detection, mine clearance, or mine destruction techniques. The amount of such mines shall not exceed the minimum number absolutely necessary for the above-mentioned purposes. Of the current 151 States Parties, 69 retain over 250,000 antipersonnel mines for training and research purposes. **Latvia** joined this group in May 2006 as it declared its intent to retain 1,301 antipersonnel mines when it submitted its initial transparency report as a State Party.

A total of 66 States Parties have thus far chosen not to retain any mines. **Hungary** (October 2005) and **Nigeria** (November 2005) recently joined this group by announcing the destruction of their entire stockpiles of retained mines. A total of 16 States Parties once possessed stockpiles but have chosen not to retain any mines. In addition, **Macedonia FYR** recently informed Landmine Monitor of its intent to destroy its entire stockpile of 4,000 retained mines in "the very near future." A total of 11 States Parties have not declared whether they intend to retain any mines, and five States Parties have expressed their intent to retain mines but have not declared the quantities.

Only five States Parties account for nearly one-third of all retained mines: Brazil (16,125), Turkey (16,000), Algeria (15,030), Bangladesh (14,999), and Sweden (14,798). A total of 10 States Parties retain between 5,000 and 10,000 mines: Namibia, Belarus, Australia, Greece, Japan, Croatia, Chile, and Serbia & Montenegro, Sudan, and Tunisia.

The majority of States Parties that retain mines, a total of 37, retain between 1,000 and 5,000 mines. **Ecuador** recently announced the destruction of 1,970 retained mines in 2005. Another 17 States Parties retain less than 1,000 mines.

States Parties agreed to adopt a new voluntary expanded reporting format for Form D on retained mines at the Sixth Meeting of States Parties in Zagreb, Croatia in November/December 2005. Initially proposed jointly by Argentina and Chile, this modified format allows States Parties to report on the intended purposes and actual uses of mines retained under Article 3. **Argentina** used the new format in their annual update for calendar year 2004 submitted in 2005. So far in 2006, reporting on calendar year 2005, **Hungary**, **Iceland**, and **Nicaragua** have made use of the new format.
