

# Status of Convention on Cluster Munitions Transparency Reporting



Under Article 7 of the convention, States Parties are required to report regularly on their activities to implement relevant obligations: what has been accomplished, what is left to do, and what are the plans for the future.



59% of States Parties have submitted their updated transparency reports for calendar year 2019.  
The convention requires that all States Parties provide annual updates on steps taken to implement their obligations, by 30 April each year.



100 States Parties have submitted their initial transparency reports. This represents 91% of the states for which the obligation applies.  
The initial report is due within six months of joining and is designed to clarify what obligations apply.
